
What Everybody Ought to Know About Risk Assessment



Did You know that:

If you employ 5 or more members of staff you should have a Written Risk Assessment.

That is the Law.

In most work places there are hazards that have the potential to cause injury or harm to health.

- Electrical Safety
- Gas Safety
- COSHH- safe use of chemicals
- Manual Handling
- Managing Contractors who come onto site
- Asbestos
- Fire
- Use of Machinery
- Working at Heights
- Use of work vehicles
- Legionella
- Assessing and safeguarding those vulnerable people in your care.

A Risk Assessment should look at all HAZARDS associated with the business and review whether the existing CONTROLS are adequate, or if in fact improved controls are required.

Let me give you an example:

Everyone carries a mobile phone these days. Often, we charge these up at work.

What if a staff member left their phone charging in the corridor where coats and outdoor clothing hung and it started a fire?



What if the fire was in your main escape route to fresh air?

Here's another example of a serious incident that can occur in any work place if adequate training and risk assessments haven't been undertaken.

This accident hit the Media when Chlorine Gas was produced at a Local Pub by a cleaner.

It prevents the risk of Potential Litigation which could ensue either by:

- Statutory Breach of Legislation (Criminal)
- Or Breach of Civil Law.
